- 1 In Australia, music is protected by copyright for 70 years following the composer's death, unless they died prior to 1 Jan 1955.
- 2 Works by composers who died prior to 1955 are public domain i.e. are no longer protected by copyright.
- 3 The printed edition of a work is protected by copyright for 25 years from the date of first publication of that edition.
- 4 Works in copyright can either be purchased or hired at the publishers' discretion. A work only for hire from one source may be available for purchase from another. However complete choral works, operettas etc. covered by "grand rights" copyright can only be hired.
- 5 "Grand rights" works can usually only be hired, typically from Hal Leonard Australia, who can also hire other copyright works.
- 6 The APRA performing rights fee paid annually by MaSO permits public performance by MaSO of all works except those covered by "grand rights". For these works, performance rights are purchased from Hal Leonard at the time of hiring scores.
